Curious about how subtle communication can impact relationships?

In the next article, we explore how Non Violent Communication (NVC) helps us move beyond surface-level politeness to truly connect with one another. Discover how empathy-based responses can transform everyday interactions, and how the Harmony Team can support you in applying these principles within your club and leadership journey.



When I give workshops in NonViolent Communication (NVC), some people feel uncomfortable with the term because they don't see themselves as violent.

I explain that violence is seen as a spectrum - from obvious harm to subtle disconnection. On one end is what we all think about when we hear the word violent - physical violence and verbal abuse. But it extends all the way to subtle nuances of how we speak to one another. Has it happened to you that you told someone something like "I'm so sad, I have no friends" and the reply you got was: "You are too hard on yourself" or "You are judgmental, loosen up a bit" or "You should get out more", etc.? Did that make you feel good? Welcome? Heard? Probably not. This is the other end of the scale: being "violent" toward others through our reactions. It's not just about yelling or being polite - it's about how we truly relate to one another. Having said that, I often refer to it as Connecting Communication instead, because this is the purpose - to stay connected with each other in conversations.

What does it mean to stay connected? Let's return to the earlier example: "I have no friends and I'm so sad about it." A connecting response would be to say: "is it sad for you because you feel lonely and you would like human connection?" or "Is it because you are bored and would like to have fun with people?"

NonViolent Communication is rooted in Empathy: in the second type of reply, we stayed with the speaker's experience rather than telling them what they are or what they should do. We explored their feelings and needs—this is how we truly understand what is going on with them. When someone is telling us something it's about them, not us.

When I see people starting to implement this shift of speaking (and thinking) I see amazing things happening to relationships between human beings.

At Toastmasters, we work as a team, and naturally many situations arise between us. Adopting this way of communication can be extremely helpful. If there's a relationship you'd like to improve, or a message you'd like to share with someone in your club but aren't sure how to do it in a connecting way, reach out to us—the Harmony Team (Petra Salmutter, Yafit Gabai). We're here to support, no matter how small the situation may seem to you. It's always better to address things while they're still 'tiny' rather than waiting until they grow into a conflict.
